Due to the time it took to register everyone for the class, we didn't actually start the class until about 5:50. Jerry Nichols and Dwayne Hardy, co-chairs of the dance development committee, had worked diligently to find excellent instructors for our first series of lessons. They were very fortunate to have Marsha Ruth and Stan Gurganus agree to teach the beginner class. As many of you might know, Marsha and Stan teach the same class for the Boogie on Bay Shag Club, Franklin Shag Club, and River City Shag Club. Marsha has been teaching shag lessons for thirty years and, even though Stan may be relatively new at teaching, he is one of the smoothest dancers on the floor and compliments Marsha's teaching very well. As we anticipated, the second class would

be somewhat smaller than the first class. On January 13th, there were thirty-four students taking the class which we are very pleased with. In the first two Saturday nights of 2024, the club had ten new members join. We, the board of directors, feel this is a great start for our club this year. With help from our club members, using social media, and word of mouth, we can promote our club's social events as being a great place to dance on Saturday nights. Those of you who use social media, please consider sharing our weekly notices about the dance lessons. At the subject meeting, several business matters were presented by Robin Morley, chair of ACSC.

Synopsis of ACSC meeting held January 13th at

SOS Mid-winter Break/Workshop event in North

Myrtle Beach

- The minutes of the previous meeting were presented by Becky Berry, ACSC Secretary.
- The financial report was given by Cecil Martin, ACSC Treasurer.
- Novlene Powell, chair of the icon committee, presented the names of five people selected for the 2024 Icon Award, which will be presented at the Spring Safari SOS in April. Marsha Ruth from Boogie on the Bay Shag Club is one of the five.
- There was a great deal of discussion about the 2025 ACSC Summer Workshop, for which the Smoky Mountain Shaggers shag club (Pigeon Forge, Tennessee) won the right to host it. To attend the event, the cost of two tickets and three nights in the hotel came to \$887 plus taxes, fees, and travel. It was noted that many of the smaller clubs can not afford to send a representative to an event this expensive; as such, the event was cancelled and the club was released from their obligation.
- Reports were given by members of the SOS
 Board of directors on the finances of SOS and
 the SOS parade, to be held during the Spring
 Safari.

The meeting included four workshops that gave attendees information about:

- the necessity of the clubs having insurance for liability protection, asset protection, and directors liability protection;
- a new SOS app for your mobile devices (see page 5);
- IRS tax requirements and exemptions for shag clubs;

What is a shag icon?

The ACSC Shagging Icon Award recognizes individuals who have made outstanding contributions within their own ACSC-affiliated shag club. Nominees for this award have made significant efforts and contributions to their shag club and are clearly outstanding members of the shag community. Although some of these nominees may go on to be well known in the shag world, many of these individuals may not be known outside of their own club. This award has come to be one of the most highly prized awards that a shagger can attain.

The path for someone to attain this award is as follows. The respective shag club president, with board approval, submits a completed Shagging Icon Award Nomination form by November 1st of the current year. The nominations are evaluated and scored based on predetermined criteria by a nine-member evaluation team. The evaluation team consists of volunteers who are past Icon award recipients and who are selected randomly at the ACSC Summer Workshop of the current year. Based on the evaluation, five people are selected as recipients and announced in January of the next year at the Mid-Winter Workshop.
